CNYCC RECEIVES PETCO LOVE GRANT

We are excited to announce that Cat Coalition is the recipient of a \$19,000 grant from Petco Love to pay for veterinary care for our foster cats! This grant will allow us to help hundreds of cats get healthy and ready for adoption. From common conditions like a litter of kittens with upper respiratory infections to emergencies like cats hit by cars to life-threatening conditions like panleukopenia (distemper), we take in cats with all kinds of medical conditions. Thanks to Petco Love, we are able to support our foster parents with the many vet bills that come with cat rescue.



Petco Love is a national nonprofit leading change for pets by harnessing the power of love to make communities and pet families closer, stronger, and healthier. Since its found-







ing in 1999, Petco Love has invested \$330 million in adoption and other lifesaving efforts. And Petco Love helps find loving homes for pets in partnership with Petco and more than 4,000 organizations-like CNY Cat Coalition-across North America, with 6.5 million pets adopted and counting.

"Our investment in the CNY Cat Coalition is part of more than \$15M in investments recently announced by Petco Love to power local organizations across the country as part of our commitment to create a future in which no pet is unnecessarily euthanized," said Susanne Kogut, president of Petco Love. "Our local investments are only part of our strategy to empower animal lovers to drive lifesaving change right alongside us. We recently celebrated the one-year launch anniversary of Petco Love Lost, a national lost and found database that uses pet facial recognition technology to simplify the search for lost pets."

Miss Veruca was found living as a stray on Syracuse's northside in December 2021. She was so petite, her rescuer first thought she was just a kitten. She was very scared of people and cowered in the back of the crate. She was named Veruca after the character Veruca Salt from *Charlie and the Chocolate Factory* because, like that character, she was a little bit salty at first!

We quickly discovered that despite her size—under 6 pounds—she was actually 1–2 years old. Poor Veruca was suffering from a severe gum disease called stomatitis and also had a terrible gum infection. It was one of the most severe cases we'd seen and the vet was amazed that she was even eating with the amount of pain she must have been in. With medication, we were able to cure the infection and bring down some of the swelling, but a full extraction

of all of her teeth was necessary to give her long-term relief.

Thanks to our amazing supporters, we were able to fundraise more than \$1,200 to cover the cost of having her teeth removed in August.

After surgery, Veruca was finally able to live without severe pain for the first time in most of her life! After being in foster care for 8 months, she had become quite a little sweetheart and was playful and loving with her foster parents. She went up for adoption at our Clay PetSmart adoption center last month and was adopted quickly by a wonderful couple who fell for her quirky and funny personality. She is now named Callie and has a new kitty brother named Louie.




