### HELP US KEEP CHANGING LIVES

- › We are 100% volunteers—no employees and no facility! Our incredible foster parents save homeless cats in their own homes, volunteers staff our adoption centers in the Clay and Fairmount PetSmarts and Luna Café, and a dedicated team help the public get their cats spayed and neutered every week.
- › Our budget of more than \$325,000 is funded primarily by donations from individual supporters like you and grants from local, state, and national foundations.
- › More than 94% of our budget goes to program expenses like spay/neuter and veterinary care.
- › We facilitate more than 2,700 spay/neuters for low-income pet owners, community TNR programs, and foster cats.
- › Nearly 1,000 homeless cats are adopted into new homes annually.

## A BRIGHTER FUTURE FOR 25+ CATS

When a volunteer discovered that an acquaintance's family farm had a pair of young kittens that needed help, she reached out to one of our foster parents to get them the care they needed.

Little did they know that these first two kittens, Scribbles and Orb, would just be the start of a massive rescue effort. A quick assessment of the farm revealed that there were actually more than 25 kittens and cats! The farmer was doing the best he could to care for them, but was overwhelmed and unable to get all of the cats fixed after they were dropped off at the property. In just a short time, the population of

cats exploded. Many of the kittens were very sick and several had eyes that were so infected they had to be surgically removed. Big rescues like this require a team effort, with many volunteers pitching in to make sure these sweet cats had a chance to get the vet care they required before they could get forever homes. Thankfully, all of the rescued cats are doing well and many have already been adopted!



## FROM A HOLE TO A WHOLE LOT OF LOVE

Over the summer, Cat Coalition fosters TNRd (trap-neuter-released) a colony of 12 cats and 4 newborn kittens on the north side of Syracuse. One elusive female avoided the traps and, unfortunately, had yet another litter of kittens. On a cold day in October, colony caretakers heard tiny meows coming from under a porch. Our volunteer belly crawled into the small space and managed to rescue two 5-week-old kittens wedged in a deep hole within the concrete foundation and a third kitten who was hiding under a trash can. Mama cat was also trapped successfully and taken to be spayed. The next morning, another kitten cry was heard, and our volunteers came back to find a fourth kitten out of reach in another deep hole within the foundation. After some time and patience, the fourth hungry kitten was lured out with food and reunited with her siblings in foster care. Thanks to the devoted caretakers, dedicated fosters, and generous donors like you, the happy family is doing well in foster care, and will be up for adoption very soon.
